

Lorenz Theiler, born in 1974 in Lucerne, completed his medical studies in Berne, Switzerland in 2000. Being trained as an anesthesiologist in the Regional Hospital of Lucerne and the University Hospital of Berne, he became board certified in 2008. In 2009, he moved to Miami, FL, USA where he worked as Assistant Professor of Clinical Anesthesiology at the Miller School of Medicine, Jackson Medical Center, Miami, FL from 2010 to 2012. Since 2014 he is Head of the Division of Ambulatory Anesthesia and Head of the Division of Anesthesia for Emergency Medicine and Prehospital Medicine at the University Hospital of Berne.

He has a strong interest in Airway Management and published numerous studies on the subject. Other research interests include the pharmacogenetic properties of Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) and its role in the prevention of postoperative nausea and vomiting.

He is the co-founder of D.A.R.C. and continues his research studies on airway management as well as his commitment in teaching airway management at various workshops, international meetings and as a regular lecturer at the University of Bern. He is also member of the ESA scientific subcommittee 10, *Resuscitation, Emergency Medicine and Trauma* and he is the Swiss Council Member for the *European Airway Management Society* EAMS. He is also responsible for the annual workshop on airway management at the ESA annual assembly. He is section editor on airway management for *Trends in Anaesthesia and Critical Care* and reviewer for multiple other journals. Apart from airway management, he enjoys hiking and skiing in the Swiss Alps where he will be found on most weekends during winter.
