



Prof. Dr. med. Robert Greif, MME, FERC

After studying medicine at the University of Vienna, Austria, Dr. Greif specialized in anaesthesiology and intensive care medicine. Following a post-doc research fellowship at UCSF-San Francisco, CA, he became an associate professor at the Medical University of Vienna in 2002. In 2004 he was recruited to the University Hospital Bern, Switzerland; and promoted to professor at the University of Bern in 2009.

Beside his engagement in clinical anaesthesia and patient care his research focuses on airway management, resuscitation and medical education. He is one of the founders of the Difficult Airway Research Collaboration (DARC).

Currently he serves as the Board Director of Training and Education for the European Resuscitation Council, as member of the European Society of Anaesthesiology's Academy and the e-Learning committee, as director of the resident training commission of the Swiss Anesthesia Society, as vice-president of the Cantonal Ethics Commission Bern, as chair of the sub-commission Master of Medicine Program, and member of the curriculum committee Master of Medical Education Program, both Medical Faculty University of Bern, and as president-elect of the European Airway Management Society. He is the current Editor-in-Chief of Trends in Anaesthesia and Critical Care, Elsevier.

He lectures and teaches courses about medical teaching, faculty development and airway management, at international conferences, several Universities in Europe, and at the University Hospital Bern medical students and residents. There he is in charge of the 5th year OSCE and leads the faculty development program of the academic teaching staff at the medical faculty of the University of Bern.

At the Department of Anaesthesiology and Pain Medicine, Prof. Greif is member of the board of directors managing the "Peripheral Anaesthesia Division", and directing the Medical Education Division including the Bern Simulation and CPR-Center (BeSiC).
